The Texian schooner of war San Jacinto, J. T. R. Lathrop, Esq., commander, arrived from Galveston on Thursday morning last, and anchored opposite the city. She is a new and very handsome vessel, of 140 tons burthen, carrying four six pound cannonades, and a long eighteen pounder amidships. She was built at Baltimore expressly for the Texian navy; and from her appearance, and the reputation of her commander, we doubt not she will prove highly efficient in the service.
