The Texas schooner of War San Jacinto arrived at Galveston on the evening of the 31st ult. Four days from Point Marie Andre. We learn from the commander of the San Jacinto, Capt. Postel, that the negotiations between this country and Mexico have been suspended. Capt. Postel is the bearer of dispatches from our agent at Mexico, Mr. Treat, to this government. The Centralists were concentrating their forces at the city of Mexico. Apt. Postel learned that considerable alarm had been created at Vera Cruz, by the appearance of the Texas vessels off the coast. They had sent of expresses from Vera Cruz to supply the castle of San Juan de Uloa with powder. The squadron were in the enjoyment of general good health. San Luis Advocate.
